Huntington County Community Schools

HCCSC is located in the Northeast part of the state and comprises all of Huntington County. The district serves more than 4,500 students across six Pre-K–5 elementary schools, two grade 6–8 middle schools, and one grade 9–12 high school. The district is also home to the Huntington County Community Learning Center, Maintenance/Technology/Transportation facility, and the HCCS Administrative Center.

HCCSC's six elementary schools are the entry point for its commitment to 21st-century education. The district's strong technology foundation supports a 1:1 iPad initiative that provides interactive, personalized learning experiences in the classroom. The curriculum focuses on digital literacy from a young age.

All elementary schools offer differentiated instruction and accelerated opportunities for students identified as high-ability. This focus allows the brightest students to receive differentiated instruction. Competitive and exploratory activities, such as the County M.A.T.H Bowl and robotics programs, are designed to build a critical foundation for later CTE/STEM pathways.

Early childhood education is a priority for HCCSC. The district's goal is to have a preschool program in every elementary school. A continuum of special services for children aged 3 to 5 provides a strong learning foundation for children entering kindergarten.

HCCSC partners with the Huntington North Learning Center to provide numerous CTE opportunities, preparing students for the workforce. The Learning Center programs include:

- Automotive
- Advanced Manufacturing
- Certified Nurses Aid (CNA)
- Construction
- EMT
- Fire and Rescue
- Criminal Justice
- Welding



In alignment with the state’s focus on employment, enlistment, and enrollment, the high school offers a broad range of programs and learning experiences. Academically, Huntington North High School offers more than 60 dual-credit courses and over 20 Advanced Placement opportunities, as well as the U.S. Army Junior ROTC program for those wishing to enlist in the military.

Impactful community partnerships include the Impact Institute, Ivy Tech Community College, Huntington University, and Work One. Together with these partners, HCCSC can offer its students the very best.

Beyond the traditional classroom, the district offers specialized extracurricular experiences for all students. There are 23 athletic teams, a wide variety of clubs and special interest groups, band, marching band, and Varsity Singers.
